ADMISSION

Admission Criteria for Acceptance

Admission is based on a combination of indicators: previous academic performance, three professional letters of recommendation, relevant professional experience, an interview, and passing of the NCLEX examination.

English Proficiency can be submitted as one of the following:

- Minimum TOEFL 80ibt (internet-based test)
- Minimum IELTS overall band score of 6.5
- Pearson Test of English (PTE) Academic score of 53
- Successful completion at a participating English language center in the USA
- Duolingo (score of at least 105)
