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The University of Scranton allots six years for the completion of a master's degree. Of the students who enrolled in 2008, 87% had successfully completed within the six years allotted. Of the students who enrolled in 2009, 90% had successfully completed the program. Of the students who enrolled in 2010, 83.7% had successfully completed the program by the beginning of the current (2015-2016) academic year.

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Students who graduated during the 2013 – 2014 academic year took an average of 2.3 years to complete the program. Because our program provides scheduling flexibility that allows for both part- time and full-time students, the time to complete the program can be as low as 2 years.

Although respondents reported that they were adequately prepared in all program objectives, we have identified a few areas in which we aim to strengthen student learning. These areas are: How to work with students with special needs (IEP meeting, counseling, etc.) (3.15); Knowledge of crisis counseling techniques: ability to respond appropriately to students and their families facing emergency situations (3.85); and How to successfully conduct classroom guidance lessons (3.8).
